Storm Water Discharges Not Associated with Special-Use Areas General Permit**

This COC authorizes the permittee to discharge an unspecified amount of storm water to a surface water(s) of the state from the facility located at the address above that meets the criteria established in General Permit No. MIS310000.

The permittee is authorized to discharge in compliance with the following requirements of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan and the General Permit:

- Source identification requirements
- Industrial Storm Water Certified Operator requirements
- Nonstructural preventative measures and source controls
- Structural storm water pollution control requirements as needed
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) requirements, if applicable (Guidance is available at the following link to assist with determining applicability: [How to find applicable TMDLs in MiEnviro Portal \(michigan.gov\)](#))
- Prohibition of unauthorized non-storm water discharges

Unless specified otherwise in the General Permit, all contact with the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (Department) and all Department approvals, shall be directed to or made by the Water Resources Division's Cadillac District Office. The Cadillac District Office is located at 120 West Chapin Street, Cadillac, Michigan 49601-2158, Telephone: 231-775-3960, Fax: 231-775-1511. If this COC authorizes discharges from a portable facility and the portable facility is to be relocated, the permittee shall notify the Cadillac District Office of the relocation, through MiEnviro Portal, at least ten (10) days prior to start-up at the new location.

Any person who is aggrieved by this COC may file a sworn petition with the Michigan Administrative Hearing System within the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, c/o the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, setting forth the conditions of the COC that are being challenged and specifying the grounds for the challenge. The Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs may reject any petition filed more than 60 days after issuance as being untimely.

The issuance of this COC does not authorize violation of any federal, state, or local laws or regulations, nor does it obviate the necessity of obtaining such permits, including any other Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy permits, or approvals from other units of government as may be required by law.

This COC is based on a complete application submitted on December 6, 2022. The permittee is subject to the conditions specified in General Permit No. MIS310000 effective April 1, 2023, expiring April 1, 2028. This COC may be modified, terminated, reissued, or revoked as allowed for in General Permit No. MIS310000. On its effective date, this COC shall supersede MIS310503 (expiring April 1, 2023).

This COC and the authorization to discharge shall expire at midnight on April 1, 2028. In order to receive authorization to discharge beyond the date of expiration, the permittee shall submit a complete application that contains such information and forms as are required by the Department by October 1, 2027.

This COC takes effect on the date of issuance.
